PROCESS FOR APPOINTMENT AS A BAIL COMMISSIONER

Bail Commissioners are appointed by the Chief Judge of the District Court and serve at the pleasure of the Court. They must be available to work on an irregular on-call schedule including nights, weekends, and holidays. Appointments are made after review of an application, a thorough background investigation, and a determination by the Chief Judge as to the need for a bail commissioner in the area where the applicant lives.

Persons who are currently employed by, or have a family member currently employed by, the following agencies/businesses, are not eligible to apply:

- A Law enforcement agency;
- A Jail/correctional facility;
- A Law firm;
- The Department of Corrections;
- A Prosecutor's office;
- A regional communications/dispatch center; and/or
- A Town/City, County, State, or Federal government agency that has a law enforcement agency under its supervision.

If appointed as a commissioner, each applicant must do the following before being allowed to begin their duties:

- Attend a mandatory training;
- Pass a fingerprint-based FBI criminal history background check;
- Complete an online certification to view Criminal Justice Information;
- Job shadow an experienced bail commissioner; and
- Open a dedicated bail commissioner bank account.

Bail commissioners are independent contractors and are not State employees. Bail commissioners are compensated pursuant to 15 M.R.S. §1023(5).
