• Serve the Documents:

Now you must give copies of the documents you received from the court, and a copy of the documents you filed with the court to the opposing party. This is called "serving" the court documents and court rules say you must do this in a certain way. Please read the Maine Judicial Branch's pamphlet titled, "Notifying the Other Party: How to Serve Court Papers," for instructions on how to serve the documents. You can get a copy of this pamphlet at the court or access it online <u>www.courts.maine.gov</u>.

• File Proof of Service:

After you serve the opposing party, you must file proof of service with the court. The Maine Judicial Branch's pamphlet titled, "Notifying the Other Party: How to Serve Court Papers," explains what you must file as proof of service depending on the method of service you use.

<u>PLEASE NOTE</u>: The court will <u>not</u> schedule your case to be heard until <u>after</u> you file proof of service.
